- ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT OF SINGLE USE PLASTIC

Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, in the address of the 74th Session of the United Nations spoke about the nationwide campaign to discontinue single-use plastics.

On the occasion of Swachh Bharat Mission 7th Anniversary, Greenhills Trust organized a city-wide campaign; following up with Awareness campaigns in schools on the environmental impact of single-use plastic.

Single-use plastics, or disposable plastics, are used only once before they are thrown away or recycled. In Almora town the problem of plastic waste disposal is compounded due to the absence of recycling facilities, as well as the limitation of landfill sites in hill topography. The campaign emphasized on the reduced usage of disposable plastics like bags, PET bottles, and utensils.

Melting down plastic waste to repurpose it into useful items is one way of reducing the landfills wastage, and recovering resources.

IN A PILOT PROJECT, GREENHILLS PARTNERED WITH PWD AND PRADHAN MANTRI GRAM SADAK YOJANA (PMGSY); 10 TONNES OF SHREDDED PLASTIC WAS PROVIDED FOR USE IN ROAD.
